

The Rule of Law


• The principle that all people and institutions are subject to and accountable to law that is fairly applied and enforced; the principle of government by law.

Natural Law

reason drawn from perceived universal and moral truths





No higher laws than the written laws of a society



Focuses on the historical understanding of what is right and wrong in a society



Takes into account current social, economic, and technological realities

All persons born or naturalized in the United States, and subject to the jurisdiction thereof, are citizens of the United States and of the State wherein they reside. Constitutional Law

- Exists at state and federal levels
- U.S. Constitution
 - provides structure
 - establishes federal system of government
 - establishes and protects individual rights

Statutory Law

- exists at federal, state, and local levels
- Codification process

Administrative

• comes from rules created by executive branch agencies and administrative agencies

Common Law

- judicial interpretation of statutes/judge made law
- stare decisis/precedent

Stare decisis means "let the decision stand."



- Civil

- Criminal
 - wrongs committed against the public as a whole

- substantive
 - provides people with rights and duties
- procedural
 - sets out rules for how to pursue substantive rights

Law v. Equity

- Law
 - monetary damages
- Equity
 - equitable relief: requires the wrongdoer to act or not act in a certain way
 - Types
 - specific performance
 - injunction
 - rescission

 - laws created by government
- Private
 - private parties determine rights
 - Contract


